Dear IPVS members,

I hope you all had a wonderful summer. It gives me great pleasure to get back to you after months of intense but quiet work on the upcoming IPVS meeting and other IPVS matters.With amazing support from Karen Canfell, the Conference Executive Committee and the Asia-Oceania Research Organisation in Genital Infection and Neoplasia (AOGIN) representatives regular meetings have been held to develop the Programme for IPVC 2018 in Sydney.

Prevention of HPV related diseases and cancers through universal vaccination and screening opens a door of hope comparable to the first medical achievements in the early days of vaccine discovery. Complexity is inherent when the beneficial effects of the vaccine takes years to be quantified and realized. Complexity is added when searching for solutions in poor-resource settings. Nevertheless, an enormous driving force in many stakeholders is helping to overcome these difficulties. The United Nations, together with several Non-Governmental Organizations (NGO) including the participation of several Ministries of Health are prioritizing the elimination of HPV related diseases and in particular cervical cancer in low and middle income countries in a

new programme directed to the elimination of cervical cancer worldwide: <u>http://www.who.int/ncds/un-task-force</u>.

IPVS membership has a uniquely qualified and experienced group of scientists and clinicians. Over the years, many members and delegates have used our meetings to communicate the most innovative research encompassing all aspects of papillomavirus science and public health measures. But, advocacy had never really been a priority until the IPVS leadership and board made the strategic decision to increase our focus on the transfer of HPV scientific knowledge towards the prevention of HPV associated diseases. This includes communicating with the general public on HPV knowledge and the benefits of evidence-based interventions. IPVS is investing our resources of people, time and capital to provide the necessary expertise to understand and solve implementation difficulties, cultural diversity and political agendas that can affect development and uptake of prevention, screening and management of HPV diseases and cancers. This is why we have committed to making the 4th of March International HPV Awareness Day, an activity that is led by our own Professor Joel Palefsky. Our first year strategy is to build a strong coalition of partners to help us raise awareness and commitment to addressing HPV and HPV associated diseases. To our great satisfaction, our outreach to scientific societies, NGOs and other stakeholders has been met with exceptional enthusiasm, generosity and a willingness to be part of an international team facilitating a wide range of amazing projects. We look forward to sharing updates on campaign progress and themes in the weeks and months ahead.


