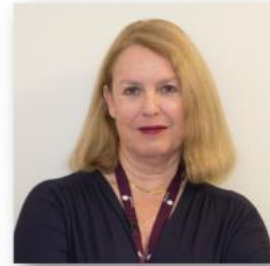

We have exciting webinars planned in 2023 in basic, clinical, behavioral and public health science with also special regional sessions



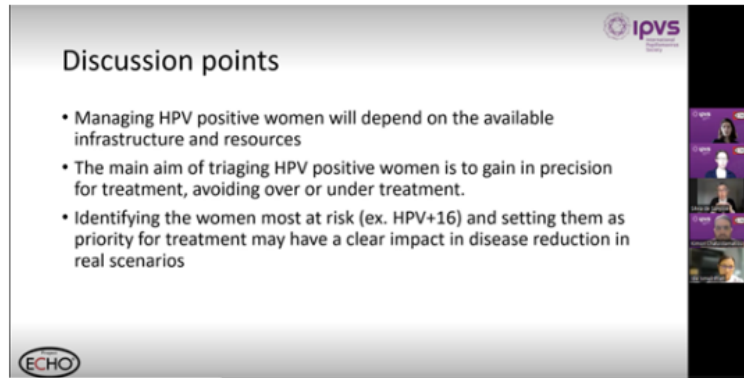
